FAU's COE Teacher Prep Program Ranked No. 1 in the State

Florida Atlantic University's Elementary Education/ESOL/Reading program shares the No. 1 ranking for teacher prep programs in the state of Florida. Findings for 2020 were published in an <u>annual report</u> prepared for the <u>Florida Department of Education</u> by <u>Education Counsel</u>. "Florida Teacher Preparation Programs: A Summary and Analysis of Program Performance" reported the results of each approved teacher preparation program's annual progress on established performance measures, as well as each program's current approval status.

"The College of Education does an outstanding job preparing teachers for public schools. We are thrilled that the Florida Department of Education has documented the success of our students — taught by a first-rate faculty — who are improving the lives of K-12 students throughout South Florida and beyond," said *Stephen Silverman, Ed.D., dean of FAU College of Education.*

At the elementary level, the top-ranked program was Elementary Education/ESOL/Reading offered by <u>FAU College of Education</u>. The third largest program reviewed, Elementary/ESOL/Reading had the greatest increase in summative score, rising from a 2.6 in 2019 to a 3.8 this year, the highest overall summative score for 2020. An alumnus of the <u>College of</u> <u>Education</u>'s <u>Department of</u> <u>Teaching and Learning</u>, w ho w as an <u>Accelerated Induction into</u> <u>Teaching</u> (AIT) Student Teacher during the spring 2020 semester, was recognized as the Beginning Teacher of the Year in the high school category by the South Region Office of the School District of PaIm Beach County for 2020-2021.

30 FAU High School Students Named National Merit Finalists

A total of 30 <u>Florida Atlantic</u> <u>University High School</u> students have been named finalists in the 2021 National Merit Scholarship Competition, the largest group in school history.

More than 1.5 million juniors in about 21,000 high schools entered the 2021 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2019 Preliminary SAT/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/ NMSQT®), which served as an initial screen of program entrants. From the approximately 16,000 semifinalists, about 15,000 were named finalists.

FAU High Earns Perfect Graduation Rate Five Years Straight

The <u>Florida Department of Education</u> recently released Florida's High School Cohort 2019-20 Graduation Rate and <u>Florida Atlantic University Lab School</u> is the only district in the state with 100 percent graduation rate for five years straight.

In 2019-20, FAU Lab School was one of only two districts in the state with a 100 percent graduation rate.

"Data like this is the result of the enormous efforts and support for our students done by our faculty and staff each and every day," said Sherry Bees, principal/director of A.D. Henderson & FAU High School. "The incredible detail missing from this report is that not only are all of our seniors graduating, but they are earning placement into the nation's top universities, into Florida Atlantic University, and usually graduating with their bachelor's degree years before their counterparts at other high schools across the state."...<u>Read more</u>
